## **VAS RECIPES**

### **Class HP42**

#### **VAS Ltd. RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION RECIPE**

Proudly sponsored by Sultana Sisters.

250g Sultanas ¼ tsp grated Nutmeg

250g chopped Raisins ½ tsp ground Ginger

250g Currants ½ tsp ground Cloves

125g chopped Mixed Peel 250g Butter

90g chopped Red Glace Cherries 250g Soft Brown Sugar

90g Chopped Blanched Almonds ½ tsp Lemon Essence OR finely grated lemon rind

250g Plain Flour ½ tsp Almond Essence

60g Self Raising Flour ½ tsp Vanilla Essence

4 large Eggs 1/3 Cup Brandy or Sherry

Method:

Mix together fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream the butter and sugar, add the essences. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin 20cm SQUARE, STRAIGHT SIDED TIN and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity, raisins to be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries 4 - 6 pieces, almonds crosswise 3 - 4 pieces.

### **Class HP52**

#### **VAS Ltd. JUNIOR BOILED FRUIT CAKE RECIPE**

(entrants must be under 18 years as at 9/10/2021)

375g Mixed Fruit ½ Cup Sherry

¾ Cup Brown Sugar 2 Eggs, lightly beaten

1 tsp Mixed Spice 2 Tablespoons Marmalade

½ Cup Water 1 Cup Self Raising Flour

125g Butter 1 Cup Plain Flour

½ tsp Bicarbonate Soda ¼ tsp Salt

Method:

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from the stove, add bicarb soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm ROUND CAKE TIN. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1½ hours, or until cake is cooked when tested

### **Class HP53**

#### **JUNIOR CARROT & DATE MUFFINS (Entrants must be under 18 yrs on 9/10/2021)**

2½ cups Self Raising Flour 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 cup Brown Sugar (firmly packed) ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg

1 cup coarsely grated carrot ⅓ cup pitted dates

1 tablespoon orange marmalade 1 cup Canola oil

2 eggs, lightly beaten ¾ cup orange juice

1 cup reduced fat milk

Method:

1. Heat oven to 190 C. (moderately hot)

2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases Classic White Muffin Cases Size (35 mm Height x 90 mm Wide x 59 mm Base)

3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates & carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice & milk. Mix until just combined .

4. Spoon mixture evenly into Muffin paper cases in muffin pan.

5. Cook for 20 minutes (to test muffins are cooked, insert cake skewer.

If it comes out clean, the muffins are ready.)

6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes, before removing to cool.



### **Class HP43**

**VAS CARROT CAKE COMPETITION** - open to all carrot cake enthusiasts

#### **CARROT CAKE RECIPE**

375 grams plain flour 345 grams castor sugar

2 teaspoons baking powder 375 ml vegetable oil

1½ teaspoons bicarb soda 4 eggs

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon 3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)

½ teaspoon ground nutmeg 220 gram tin crushed pineapple, drained

½ teaspoon allspice 180 grams pecans, chopped

2 teaspoons salt

Method:

1. Pre-heat oven to 180° C (160° C fan). Grease a 23 cm round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift dry ingredients together into a bowl.
3. In a separate bowl beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
4. Bake for approximately 1 hr 30 mins or 1 hr 40 mins hours or until a bamboo skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.
5. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.
